

Ted HHK is also hopefully on the mend.


Our grey nomads have headed north with AIG being the latest to leave town don't forget to remember the hardy ones left at home.

Beachside Caravan Park Yeppoon

As it's name suggest, Beachside Caravan Park overlooks the 20 km Farnborough Beach just north of Yeppoon. A picturesque park in a tropical setting surrounded by magnificent sea views and a bay of islands. You are assured of plenty of fishing, pineapples and tropical fruit and vegetables in season. Powered caravan sites are available from where the lights of Great Keppel Island can be viewed.

Yeppoon - You'll be Back

Yeppoon has long been a bit of a grey nomad hotspot ... and it's very easy to see why.

Situated about 40 kilometers east of Rockhampton it's a great place to take a bit of a breather as you head up or down the coast. It's got some great caravan parks, is right next door to a stunning national park, state forests and conservation area, and its 1.5 kilometers of safe beaches are just a great place to relax. Oh, and to put the icing on the cake, the town with a population of 7,000 or so is friendly and well serviced.

As you do head south from Yeppoon, you are afforded magnificent views out to sea. From Wreck Point Lookout you can see all of the major islands, including Great Keppel and North Keppel islands. And if you are keen to visit the palm-filled paradise isles you can take a boat from Roslyn Bay Boat Harbour. It takes about half an hour to get across.

Byfield National Park covers some 15,000 hectares and boasts massive sand dunes, as well as rugged granite pinnacles like The Peaks and Mt Atherton. In the eucalypt woods and rainforest areas, birdlife is abundant, so twitchers don't forget your binoculars.

The state forest is actually far more accessible than the national park and it offers excellent camping as well. The area has about 7,000 hectares of exotic pine plantation and 17,000 hectares of native forest, as well as pockets of rainforest along Waterpark Creek.

The Yeppoon area then, by any measure, is genuinely magnificent. The town itself has retained its friendly village atmosphere and the surrounding countryside and islands has more than enough to keep you interested.

The DISH



Trip to VK5MS to meet Sam Jewell G4DDK and look at a big dish

On Thursday 20th August Roger VK3ADE and Ian VK3AXH set off from Ballarat at 10am to travel to a small dot on the South Australian map called Hatherleigh which is

located some 16km west of Millicent in South Australia. It took 4hrs 20mins for the journey which included a lunch break at Casterton. The weather was magnificent with the sun shinning down and the beautiful green pasture around the area. Apart from the odd car and an Emu the trip was pleasant with Roger's Tom Tom navigator keeping us on track.

The purpose of out trip was mainly to meet Sam Jewell G4DDK who is a well know amateur in the microwave world of amateur radio and features in many of the well known RSGB and other ham radio publications around the world.

Both Roger and Ian had made Sam's 1296MHz preamps from kits and were keen to find out the methods of tuning etc. After some discussion we found the most suitable methods and will put them into practice to gain the best performance which is around 0.25uv of noise for approximately 36dB of gain.

The other purpose of the trip was to look at the dish that Chris VK5MC has finished after approx a 6 year time frame. As can be seen in the pictures below it's big. The dish diameter is 32ft and is controlled by hydraulic rams for elevation and has a pump driving one of the 4 wheels that carries the entire structure on a circular track of concrete.

Chris kindly showed its performance by demonstrating measurement of sun noise which was very impressive together with auto tracking which was designed by John Drew VK5DJ.

Around 6pm we traveled to Tantanoola Pub on the Mt Gambier side of Millicent for a get together with other local amateurs for a counter meal and presentation by Sam about the UK and his preamp design and future projects.

We left the pub at 10pm and traveled via Mt Gambier to arrive back in Ballarat around 1:30am. A great day was had by both of us.

A HAM of the RADIO KIND.

Reminisces of Norm D'Angri VK3LBA.

In the BARG library is this A4 sized bindings of 19 pages in which Norm tells about how he became involved with Amateur radio. He mentions the early beginnings as he constructed his first crystal set then onto a four valve TRF radio. It makes an interesting read as he mentions names of the Ballarat amateurs who were around from the 1940's and his involvement with them. He describes how he had to put amateur radio aside while building the family home and eventually coming back to sit for his license in 1992. The in between years was spent building audio amplifiers and listening to recorded music and developing an interest that he had in black and white photography.

The journal is extensively adjourned with copies of his logbook and samples of the many QSL's he has received over the years. With time this interest in photography has moved onto computer graphics and Norm has been responsible for producing many items such as club special event QSL's and certificates, presentation coasters, club logos and many other items that members of BARG and others will be familiar with.

Norm was made a Life member of the BARG in 2005 for his services to the club.

I have really enjoyed reading this journal which is more graphical then textual and see how one person has made the hobby of amateur radio a rewarding and beneficial activity in his life. Well done Norm.

Club members are invited to borrow the journal from our library in the normal way and to enjoy reading it.

Maybe we should all make up a small resume and collection of our own activities for future amateurs to read and show how "we did it in the old days" and also for the social history value when others want to write about the hobby. Its now a few years ago but there was a small publication produced by the WIA that promised others would follow that documented our history and evolvement in the hobby of radio communications.
