
VHF and Above for December 2016

This month has seen some movement in propagation with the beacons located in Adelaide, Mt Gambier, Mildura and others noticeably stronger and more consistent in recent times.

Several club members are active in the mornings on 2m SSB and above and include VK3GGG, VK3ALM, VK3BNC, VK3KG, VK3KQT, VK3AIG and VK3AXH.

This past week Peter VK5PJ reported hearing the BARG's 1296 MHz beacon which is probably the first time for this season.

Several of our microwave group took part in a field test day with Bob VK3BNC operating 3.4G from Springmount near Creswick, Craig VK3KG at Cherry Tree in the Smythesdale area on 3.4G, John VK3AIG near Clarks Hill with 2.4G, 3.4G, and 10G and Ian VK3AXH at GreenHill with 2.4G, 3.4G, 5.7G and 10G. I'm pleased to say that contacts were made between us all on 3.4G and some success on the other bands but with some work to do.





An upcoming event is the National VHF/UHF Spring Field Day to be held on the weekend of 26th and 27th November. Given the changeable weather and some problems with equipment members have decided to use this event as another test day...weather permitting !!!

The group plans to setup at Mt Buninyong and hopefully be operational from 6 metres

through to 10GHz. The only exception to this is Craig VK3KG who will setup at Mt Elephant if suitable access can arranged and again the weather is ok. He will be operational on both 2mx and 3.4G

If you are interested in seeing this aspect of our hobby in action why not pay a visit to Mt Buninyong on the Saturday afternoon. Members expected to take part are VK3BNC, VK3AIG, VK3AXH, VK3KQT and local amateur VK3IDL.


