Radio Modernisation Project:

We have had major success with our funding applications from both the Wireless Institute of Australia (WIA) and the Ballarat City Council as part of the Radio Modernisation Project.

The **WIA Clubs Grant Scheme** received 16 applications for funding from clubs around Australia. The Review Panel recommended the awarding of \$5,000 to be split amongst 5 groups, of which BARG were one of the fortunate recipients. The Review Panel report stated the following in relation to BARG's application:

"Ballarat Amateur Radio Club, with an 80% WIA membership, \$900 to fund phase 3 of stage 1 of a project to establish a modern HF and 2 metre and 70 centimetre club station providing facilities for remote access in times of emergency and for members from their homes and elsewhere, described by the Committee as the most innovative of all the proposals submitted, and also commended as being very well presented."

The **\$900** will enable the club to purchase / install antennas for 160m, 30m, 17m, 12m and 6m at the Club rooms, along with coaxial relays and computer interface cards to control the relays and the antenna rotator.

The **Ballarat City Council** awarded BARG **\$1,995** to purchase a new 160m – 6m radio as part of their 2006 Ballarat Community Council Grant scheme. Although the presentation of the cheque will not take place until late September, at a formal ceremony, the BARG Committee authorised David, **VK3UR**, to negotiate with suppliers and purchase the radio in accordance with the Radio Modernisation Project plan. A **Kenwood TS-480sat** and **voice synthesizer unit** were purchased from **Strictly Ham Pty Ltd** and presented by David, **VK3UR**, to President Bob, **VK3NBV**, at the August General Meeting.

Works are now underway to identify which of the old HF radios will be disposed of and to install the new TS-480sat into the shack. Works will also commence to purchase / construct / install some of the new antennas and ancillary control equipment.

The WIA has granted \$900 towards the replacement/upgrade of antennae and associated hardware at the BARG Clubrooms.

The City of Ballarat Grants Committee has approved a grant of \$1995 towards the Radio Modernisation Project and a new Kenwood Transceiver covering 160 through 6 metres has already been purchased.

General Business

Ernie VK3DET sought clarification of the distribution of grant funding from the WIA which was explained by David VK3UR

David VK3UR also responded to a question relating the to operation of the APRS Repeater at Mt Hollowback. The problem is expected to be resolved in the very near future and will be operational in the near future.

The membership fee issue was raised and members were advised the committee did not seek any change. Fees to remain at \$30 for individuals and \$40 for families.

Propagation Report:

Well there has been some good openings on some of the HF band this past month. I have heard a few contests on and there were good DX contacts to be had on 80, 40 and 20 metres.

Roger, **VK3ADE**, reports that Doug, **VK3FDRE**, now has an excellent signal on 80 metres. I understand Doug has been working on his antenna setup so it's great to see the improvement not only over the short distances but the ones further afield as well.

John, **VK3AIG**, reports good signals to ZL on 160 metres with 599 reports in the early evening.... might ask what's happening to all the 160 metre verticals we made?????

On VHF and above both Kevin, **VK3WN**, and Brian, **VK3KQB**, report some openings on 2 metres SSB to Tasmania and South Australia. David, **VK3YNB**, has also been active on a few of the bands.

VK3AXH EME Activity since installation of a 4x5WL 144MHz Array

My 1st EME contact was with W5UN on 21/8/04 using a single 12el yagi with no elevation. A further 14 contacts were made using the single yagi until use of the new array began on 3/4/06. The array is by DJ9BV and optimized by Lionel VE7BQH with all 18 elements of each yagi insulated from the boom. Only horizontal polarization is employed.

Total contacts to the end of August 2006 on 144 are as follows:-

Included in the above there are 2 CW and 2 SSB QSO's. Both SSB contacts were with **RN6BN** using his famous 1920 element array with Vertical and Horizontal Polarization. The initial SSB contact was tried after receiving signal levels of –6dB at both ends using JT65B on Saturday 26th August. Sam called me and I received him at 5X1 and he received me 4x4. We had 3x1 minute overs each. Sam's log show this as the longest distance of 13,918Km in his list of 162 SSB contacts.

On Sunday 27th August at around 0640 UTC Sam began calling CQ using JT65B alternating between Vertical and Horizontal Polarity. He was 8dB stronger on Vertical Pol to me. When I saw a level of –6dB I called him on SSB and was surprised to hear him come back with a 5x1 report. I gave him 4x1 and again we had 3x1 minute overs.

It's great fun and I look forward to many more EME contacts in the future on 2 metres and eventually some of the higher bands.

Remembrance Day Contest:

The RD contest for this year has been and gone. This year we had 4 operators take part (from the club rooms) they were VK3ADE Roger, VK3ADX Merv, VK3DET Ernie and VK3SE Steve. We started at 6pm Saturday night and used the VK5 RD logging program all taking turns both on the radio and on the logger. There were some great contacts made on 80mtrs and 40mtrs during this time some stations already having some big numbers, and our numbers were also starting to creep up. We put out a few calls over RBA for any stations to come up on10mtrs but we only had 2 takers VK3BEB Rick for 2 points and VK3CB Cliff, but the distance was a little too great for Cliff (thanks anyway fellas). Roger and Merv left at about 11.30pm leaving Ernie and myself to do the (freezing) grave yard shift, picking up much needed 2 points after 1am. Contacts picked up as everyone was after the 2 pointers. Contacts went well working 80mtrs to about 3.00am then started to drop off. I think the eyes of everyone were dropping out too. It got pretty hard from then on and even harder from 4.30 to 6.00am. Then the alarm clocks started to go off and the punters started to wake up. Roger and Merv turned up sometime about 8am I think? Some stations around on 80mtrs then moving to 40mtrs until fading occurred then back to 80mts and then after 17 contacts on 20mtrs we called it a day at 1pm on Sunday as our eyes were about to fall out. Merv had 2 CW contacts but not a lot of CW Contest activity was observed. No contacts on 160mtrs as there is at the moment no antenna, a pity again double points for that band. We did not log any VHF/UHF contacts and just decided to concentrate on HF. Contacts made for the contest were 310 with total points of 371.

Amateur Radio Practical Examination:

With the introduction of the latest Foundation licence certificate, also came a new element to the licence and that was the requirement to pass a practical assessment. This requirement has been in force since Oct 2005 and also applies now to the other two amateur licence exams. If a person has never held and amateur licence before and they are contesting the Foundation, Standard or the Advance licence then they MUST also submit for assessment in the practical examination. The only exception is when an amateur who currently holds a licence wants to do an upgrade they do not need to be re assessed for the practical again. The practical test is the same for all three licence levels.

THE 2006 BALLARAT HAMVENTION HOME BREW COMPETITION CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

OVERVIEW:

The aim of the 2006 Ballarat Hamvention Home Brew Competition is to encourage the design and construction of equipment that aids or assists with the enjoyment of radio communications. This typically includes, but is not limited to:

- Amplifiers
- Antenna Tuning Units
- Control Systems
- Power Supplies
- Radio Antennas
- Receivers
- Test Equipment
- Transmitters

Previous winners from former Home Brew competitions include:

- A Light Dependant Relay for Switching 240VAC Equipment Jeff Arnold, SWL (Novice category)
- A 13.8V DC Regulated Power Supply by John, VK3TJW (Experienced category)
- A 40m SSB Transceiver by Noel, VK3FGN (Expert category)
- An 80m SSB Transmitter by John, VK3TJW (Expert category)

This is an honesty system and entrants use the following criteria. There will be 3 sections of competition, comprising: Novice, Experienced, and Expert. It is permissible for an entrant to enter above, but not below, their section.

The Hamvention Organising Committee is particularly keen to see entries that provide practical assistance to the new Foundation Licence members.

NOVICE:

- 1. Is a person who is NOT, or was NOT, professionally involved in the design or building of equipment; AND
- 2. Has no amateur licence, or has held an amateur licence for less than two years; AND
- 3. Has built less than 5 projects (Kits or own design).

EXPERIENCED:

1. Is a person who is NOT, or was NOT, professionally involved in the design or building of equipment; AND

- 2. Has held an amateur licence for more than two years and less than 10 years; OR
- 3. Has built more than 5 simple projects. (Kits or own design)

EXPERT:

- 1. Is a person who is, or was, professionally involved in the design or building of equipment; OR
- 2. Has held a amateur licence for 10 years or more; OR
- 3. Anyone who doesn't fit any of the above.

REGISTRATION:

- 1. There is no cost to enter the Home Brew Competition and you may enter as many entries as you wish.
- 2. All entries must be accompanied by a separate Entry Form.
- 3. All entries, and Entry Forms, must be presented to the Home Brew Competition Co-ordinator by 09:30 on Sunday, 5th November, 2006. Entries received after this time, will be displayed but ineligible for the competition.
- 4. All entries must be collected on the day of the Hamvention.

JUDGING AND JUDGING CRITERIA:

- 1. Workmanship which covers facets including mechanical construction, soldering, layout, good practice for the radio frequencies used, use of suitable materials, controls with knobs and labels, serviceability, safety and appearance.
- 2. Originality will be considered as will complexity of the project and the documentation.
- 3. Judging will occur on the morning of the Hamvention, with the prize winners being announced during the course of the day. The judges decision will be final, and no correspondence shall be entered into.
- 4. Pictures of entries and a summary of the judges remarks may be published on the BARG Web Site (www.barg.org.au) and BARG Newsletter after the Hamvention.
- 5. If the item is contained in a box, the box should be unscrewed and open to allow inspection of the item.
