





Presidents Report

Well the month has rolled around and we are looking at our Annual Hamvention activities which is the clubs main fundraiser for the coming twelve months. Apart from our "quick" raffles" run on a meeting night for a "mystery prize" the hamvention sets us up for a comfortable financial position for the upcoming year. Our meeting night raffle generally covers the suppers and towards our Christmas party. The end of year party will be held on Friday the 10th of December at the clubrooms so keep the date clear and let the secretary know if you and the XYL are coming year cater for it. A request has been made for Nicholas Claus to drop in and share a moment with us. More in the next newsletter. It was decided to maintain membership fees to \$40 for the coming year however with many costs rising we may need to look at other ways to maintain our profitability while still enjoying the actual amenity of the club. We will be running another Foundation training course and assessment on the weekend of the 12-13-14 Nov and can accept a max of five candidates. If you know someone who is interested then get them to contact me and make a booking. I have two others currently.

Finally a word re the club repeater: Due to problems on the VK3RBA site on Mt Buninyong earlier this year, we have obtained a new site and another repeater unit and are just awaiting the return of the clubs cavities from AR Vic to complete the installation. The new system will have a controller that allows for tone and DTMF access control which wasn't available before .

In the meantime we have use of the WICEN portable repeater VK3RWP [146.925 Neg offset] and I encourage members to use this as much as possible and to test out its coverage.

Initially this was set up at the club rooms but later moved to Mt Helen area and reports have varied initially while on test. Currently its using a horizontal antenna but it has been heard as far away as Colac. It should be on the hill before the hamvention.

I take this opportunity to publise the Project Construction competition for the hamvention Details are on the BARG web page and is open to all comers to encourage the building of electronic equipment. There are three categories and prize money is available. We will also have lucky door prizes by admission ticket.

Finally we will need some assistance on the day before the hamvention to pick up and layout tables for the hamvention as well as Sunday. . If you can be available then contact any committee member and lets know. On the day it would help if we can all assist traders as they arrive [bring a trolley cart] or direct traffic parking, gate entry control and pre ticket sales.

Minutes

Of the previous committee meeting held 14th July 2010 had previously been circulated. Moved FGC, Seconded VBA that they be accepted as an accurate record of that meeting, carried

Business Arising

Application to council for Community Events Grant had been lodged, we would perhaps try to make a case for a Community Services Grant in the next round.

Correspondence

Out – Grant Application In – Acknowledgment of Grant Application. Anonymous donation for Hamfest competition prizes.

General Business

Bill proposed to revert to a paper based system for keeping financial records, he thought this would be adequate for our needs, and be simpler for him to manage.

Doug VBA had found out from his contact on Council, that we were not entitled to have the clubs' rubbish bins emptied unless we are willing to pay \$75.00 a year, our neighbour was happy to combine our recycling with his. It was decided by committee that we would arrange to take our rubbish away, and dispose of it ourselves.

Doug VBA commented that the immediate past presidents' details weren't shown on the club website list of Office-Bearers.

The security light at the club had ceased to operate, authority was given to Doug VBA, and Gordon FGC to investigate, and purchase replacement as required.

Committee voted to continue to serve supper at meetings, encourages people to stay around and socialise rather than going straight home.

Committee also voted to continue with the monthly raffles, helps pay for suppers, and allows membership fees to be set at a relatively low level. Anyone willing to donate raffle prizes should feel free to contact treasurer, or another committee member.

The WICEN repeater at the clubrooms had gone faulty (low output), and been taken to WICEN for repair. Gordon FGC reported that from a WICEN perspective there had been not a lot happening regarding the return of BARG repeaters to Mt Buninyong.

Our next door neighbour has seen people hanging around at night in the vicinity of the clubrooms.

When the weather improves a bit we need a working bee at the club, spout cleaning, general maintenance, stencilling of name on trestles, various other tasks.

Ian AXH is preparing the Beacons for their eventual return to operation when approval is granted to replace them on the tower at Mt Buninyong.

Warren suggested that in order for committee meetings to run more smoothly we could perhaps circulate an agenda beforehand. Agenda items should be in no later than the Monday before the meeting - CMC and FDRE to discuss.

Jeff PAP sought, and was given, approval to buy some hand tools to better equip the workshop, \$100.00 limit was suggested.

Christmas break-up will be the usual format. Santa may, or may not come.

Peter FPOL will be our guest speaker for the November meeting, it was suggested that this might be a good time to have a "Ladies Night".

There were several suggestions for possible future club events, these included -Visit to Watsonia Barracks and museum. Visit to Talbot Museum and Historical radio display Visit to GREC and / or GARC in Geelong. Show and Tell at meetings. Technical lectures, demonstrations on suitable subjects. Talks on various general subjects – Steam Radio and Restored vehicles were both suggested.

Craig CMC had found quite a supply of award certificates at the clubrooms, he will discuss with Ernie DET, and the General membership how these might best be used.

The time being 1830, it was thought that the meeting had gone on for long enough, and it was closed by President Craig.
