



SOLUTION TO PUZZLE.

Here are the possible readings to solve the puzzle from last month:-

Reading No 1.

Split the circuit into 3 sections containing 7, 7 and 6 resistors as Figure 1. Measure across one of the 7 sections in series with the 6 section :- 3 possible readings result viz

(a) 1/6 ohms indicating that the short is in the 7 section.

(b) 1/7 ohms indicating that the short is in the 6 section.

(c) 13/42 ohms indicating that the short is in the unmeasured 7 section.

Reading No 2.

If the 6 section contains the short make it up to 7 with a resistor from the others otherwise proceed as follows. Spilt the 7 resistors into 3 parts containing 3,2 and 2 as Figure 2. Measure across the 3 section in series with one of the 2 sections:- 3 possible readings result viz (a) 1/2 ohms indicating that the short is in the 3 section.

(b) 1/3 ohms indicating that the short is in the 2 section.

(c) 5/6 ohms indicating that the short is in unmeasured 2 section.

Reading No 3.

If the short is in one of the 2 sections of reading No 2 make it up to 3 with a known 1 ohm resistor from the others and proceed as in Figure 3. Measure across the 1 in series with (1 plus known in parallel)


Two possible readings result viz


(a) 1 ohm indicating that the resistor in the (1 plus known) is shorted.

(b) 1/2 ohms indicating that the other resistor is shorted.


If the short is in the 3 section [(a) of Reading No 2] set aside one of the 3 resistors and add a known resistor across one of the remainder as in Figure 4.A further possible reading results viz (c) 1 + 1/2 ohms indicating that the resistor set aside is shorted.

Young Hams Net


This is now each Wednesday at 8pm on 3.590MHz minus QRM. Look for the net control VK3SAA and join in, everyone welcome.
