Our Christmas break up went extremely well, perfect weather and we set up in the shade of the large tree out the front of the club. There was no shortage of food, drink or good company.




Doug and Peter did most of the cooking and by a stroke of just good luck, there was more than enough supervision of the proceedings to make sure everything was done just right.

#### VHF and Above for December 2020

It's hard to comprehend that the year is almost over as we come into the season when propagation can throw all sorts of conditions at us. The past few weeks hasn't let enthusiasts down with plenty of digital and voice communications being heard on 6mx and 2mx. Over the past weeks there has been plenty of openings on both these bands to all States in VK as well as ZL and FK8.

Perhaps the most interesting thing that has occurred in VK has been the success of so many VK's on 6mx into South America with beams pointing down over the Arctic region. One of our achievers is Steve VK3ZAZ/OT picking up 2 additional countries now making his total over 140 which is a great achievement. These last two qso's was with the digital mode JT65A. In addition to these conditions there was also a WSPR communication between a VK2 and a VK6 which created a new distance record within VK. If only the 2 stations had been in attendance perhaps that could have become a new SSB record as well.

There have been some good SSB openings into VK7 on 2mx and also the beacons from NW Tasmania being heard in lots of places in VK3 and some good SSB qso's as well.

I hope you all get plenty of DX over the coming weeks and look forward to hearing what's been heard in you shack early in the new year.

The VHF/UHF Spring Field Day has come and gone with some club members participating namely VK3TOT from home and VK3BNC and VK3AXH from Mt Buninyong. Gear in operation ranged from 2m through to 10G. Although only a few hours of participation was undertaken signals between Mt Tassie and Buninyong were S9 which was great with Ralph VK3WRE at the other end.
