It being a ground station h.f. fixed frequency receiver of 21 valves.





#### **HF Bands**

Steve VK3SE reports the following activity.

10 Metres – Over the past 4 weeks there has been a lot of activity with very strong signals within VK and the odd short opening to the USA Modes of operation include both SSB and FM. Steve has had around 80 contacts with other locals VK3WN and VK3ADE being heard. An active station on 10M is Doug VK9ZLN on Lord Howe Island so keep a look out for him.

15 and 20 Metres have also provided so good contacts within VK and ZL

- 40 Metres Another station VK9FLHI Des is also on Lord Howe and using a dipole is working many stations. Its good to see our new Foundation Licensees being active and promoting our hobby.
- Well what a month its been with the following stations getting amongst the activity. VK3WN, VK3AIG, VK3IDL, VK3SE, VK3BNC, VK3AXH and possibly more. Brian VK3KQB has got his IC502 going as will be looking for contacts as well. Activity has been mainly within VK and ZL with a few FK8's being on as well. Its been possible to work most states with very moderate power together with a simple antenna so keep an eye on the Magic Band.

#### VHF and Above

Again this band has had some great openings with plenty of locals getting amongst the DX on 2 metres. Most of the active stations on SSB have been able to work into VK1/2/3/4/5/6/7 with the beacon in Alice Springs being heard on several occasions.

Water Displacement WD - 40. The product began from a search for a rust preventative solvent and de greaser to protect missile parts. WD- 40 was created in 1953 by three technicians at the San Diego Rocket Chemical Company. Its name comes from the project that was to find a "water displacement" compound. They were successful with the fortieth formulation, thus WD-40. The Corvair Company bought it in bulk to protect their atlas missile parts.

The workers were so pleased with the product, they began smuggling (also known as "shrinkage" or "stealing") it out to use at home. The executives decided there might be a consumer market for it and put it in aerosol cans. The rest, as they say, is history.

It is a carefully guarded recipe known only to four people. Only one of them is the "brew master." There are about 2.5 million gallons of the stuff manufactured each year. It gets its distinctive smell from a fragrance that is added to the brew.

Ken East (one of the original founders) says there is nothing in WD-40 that would hurt you.

When you read the "shower door" part, try it. It's the first thing that has ever cleaned that spotty shower door. If yours is plastic, it works just as well as glass. It's a miracle!

Then try it on your stovetop... Viola! It's now shinier than it's ever been. You' all be amazed.

Here are some of the uses:

Protects silver from tarnishing.

Gives floors that 'just-waxed' sheen without making it slippery.

Restores and cleans chalkboards.

Removes lipstick stains.

Loosens stubborn zippers.

Removes stains from stainless steel sinks.

Removes dirt and grime from the barbecue grill.

Keeps ceramic/terra cotta garden pots from oxidizing.

Removes tomato stains from clothing.

Keeps glass shower doors free of water spots.

Camouflages scratches in ceramic and marble floors.

Keeps scissors working smoothly.

Lubricates noisy door hinges on vehicles and doors in homes.

Lubricates gear shift and mower deck lever for ease of handling on riding mowers.
