



Propagation Report for December 2007

HF Bands

Little to report this month. However there is likely to be in the near future when Neil VK3GND gets his new beaut inverted "L" up for 160 metres. Neil has been working away on this band for a while now with mixed success. The latest is Neil has received several good reports including one from a VK7 located at Perth (Tas) with a 5x9+20 signal. There are more mods to be done yet with ground radials and to make it exactly as the antenna designer says. Neil's signal will be so strong you may not even have to turn on your radio hi. If you have been busy setting up new installations then let us know about it.

50 MHz

Kevin VK3WN reports little activity this month. There has been a few spasmodic openings to VK4 and some TV carrier from ZL but nothing of any significance

VHF Bands

Enthusiasts on these bands have had a great time recently with another opening to VK6. In addition there has been regular propagation into VK5 and VK7. Local club members heard working on both 2m, 70cm and 23cm include – VK3AIG, VK3IDL, VK3AXH, VK3GND, VK3WN, VK3CMC and possibly others.

The two Ian's VK3IDL and VK3AXH conducted a test across town on 2.4GHz. With VK3AXH's station setup on the flat roof of his garage and VK3IDL using his gridpack antenna located on his mast a successful contact was made around 8:30pm a few Sunday evenings ago. Even though low height and significant obstructions were in the path the signal reports were excellent with 5x9+ in one direction and 5x2 in the other. The lower report being only 50mW being used at one end.

Testing was also performed on the "BIG WHEEL" antenna for the 1296MHz beacon. With the antenna held up in the shack at VK3AXH a successful contact was made with Ian VK3IDL at 5x9 signals. With some mechanical tidy up the antenna will be ready at the end of the week

This activity is generating quite a lot of interest from members interested in higher band operation.

Many thanks to all that have contributed to this section of the newsletter over the past 12 months. I wish to extend best to you all for the coming Festive Season and 2008



Obituary



"Woody" - fire radio pioneer

JOHN Stanley Brudenell, Young Woodburn, of "Wandobah" Dunkeld and known to all his friends as Woody, has died in Hamilton aged 86.

Farmer, scout leader, yachtsman, pianist, historian, collector extraordinaire, volunteer firefighter, radio expert and "ham" (VK3AGD) – John Woodburn was a remarkable man and a leader in many fields. He was a Life Member of both Dunkeld Fire Brigade and Dunkeld and District Historical Museum.

Woody joined Dunkeld Fire Brigade in 1943 and was immediately made 6th lieutenant. He remained a lieutenant until 1954 when he was elected Captain and was a "wireless lieutenant" from 1957 to 1975. In all he was a brigade member for 64 years. Perhaps this is not surprising the loss of his parents home in Dunkeld during the disastrous 1944 fires would have been scared into his memory.

Woody's involvement in the development of radio communication for the fire service is the stuff of legend. He continued the pioneering work of Hugh O"Rorke of Westmere and Leigh Simpson of "Sazli" Dunkeld (Woody's father-in-law), who in 1946 were responsible for forming the first effective fire brigade communications network in the world. It is interesting to note that this development was met with apathy, indifference and even opposition from the CFA and others at that time. O"Rorke was once told that a wet bag was far more effective at a fire than a radio!

By 1952 there were 157 radio stations operating in Victoria but it was only the following year that the CFA appointed a radio engineer and decided to develop communications State-wide. By contrast John Woodburn was there right from the start. After World War II he and Leigh Simpson bought a suitcase radio used by British spies in occupied Europe from the Wireless Institute of Australia for $\pm 12/10/00$. It was used both as a

base station and a mobile. Woody also built the first ever listening set for a private fire tanker and with Hugh O'Rorke's son Kevin designed a two-way high frequency (HF) base radio in 1962 which was used at "Wandobah" as part of the Westmere Group network until the late 1970's.

By the early 1960's the authorities were convinced. Following serious fires in Western Australia Woody, Kevin, Tony Wilson and others were asked to visit the West and spread the message about the value of radio communications during bushfires.

A convoy of vehicles and equipment including Woody's indefatigable Mercedes HOF – 353, formed "Operation Phoenix", and headed off across the Nullabor on what became an Australian communications milestone.

Sadly the old "Merc" having completed more than 6000,000 km last year became part of a compressed heap of scrap metal collected from "Wandobah" in the "Smorgon Steel Great Scrap Roundup". Ironically this process resulted in a generous donation of nearly \$1000 to Dunkeld Fire Brigade so Woody's old car has helped the volunteer fire brigade cause even as it was being squashed flat!

Today we take for granted the extensive radio communication system which is a basic and essential facility for all firefighting operations. We should pause to remember the hard-fought battles by Woody and his colleagues all those years ago not only against the vagaries of temperamental equipment but also with uncooperative bureaucrats.

Woody's extraordinary collection of communications equipment through the years has to be seen to be believed. Some of it is on display at the Dunkeld Museum and it is pleasing to note that the family intend to carefully preserve his legacy for posterity.

I count it a privilege to have know Woody for more than 35 years. Others of course knew him far longer. He was a loyal supporter of Serra Fire Brigade Group and even during last summer was able to pass on very useful weather information from his radio contacts during a fire. He frequently participated in radio skeds on his UHF set as "Wandobah" Base and as recently as a month ago requested me to program the new frequency of the Cherrymount (Glenthompson) Repeater into his listening set. Sadly, I was too late to meet his request.

John Woodburn was a brilliant and unique individual and will be sorely missed by his family, colleagues and friends. However his memory will live on as long as any firefighter picks up a radio microphone and transmits a message about a fire.

Woody's wife Garland predeceased him in 2006 and his children Tom, Wendy and Jane, sons-in-law Chris Macpherson and Craig Oliver and grandsons Leigh and Lachlan Oliver survive him.

This is the very last Newsletter for 2007. Hope to see you all at the BARG BBQ on Friday 14th December at the clubrooms.

I have a working IRLP node (Node 6036) running out of home (Mnt Helen) on 439.175 for those in Ballarat that may struggle to get to Ben Nevis, club members are welcome to use it.
