

Down to the Wire

What's faster?? Morse code or text messaging?

It was a mad dash – with dots – recently at Sydney's Powerhouse Museum when veteran telegraph

operators Gordon Hill and Jack Gibson took on a couple of kids and their mobile phones in a race to send the quickest message. The rules were simple: 93-year-old Hill had to translate a message into morse code and send it to 82-year-old Gibson to decode the transmission and print it out using a manual typewriter. Meanwhile, 13-year-old Brittany Devlin punched the same transmission into her mobile phone using text messaging and send it to nine-year-old Ben Hutchinson's phone nearby. And the winner? Morse code romped home. It took 90 seconds for Gibson to have the message down on paper. The text message appeared 18 seconds later. Victory to the tried-and true 19th century invention.

We still don't know the technical name for the antenna (Reg CAZ may have clues).


It's use is for BBC Radio Wiltshire, 1332kHz, 300W at Lacock. (Grid reference ST928674).


