# **October General Meeting:**

The next General Meeting will be held on Friday, 28<sup>th</sup> October, commencing at the club rooms. Following the business of the meeting Craig, **VK3CMC**, will give an overview on the changes to the Australian Amateur Radio Service licences. Ian, VK3AXH, will discuss the forthcoming Hamvention and slot people into various jobs. The remainder of the evening will be spent reorganising the club rooms for the Ballarat Airport Open Day.

# **IRLP / Web Site:**

Following a very interesting presentation from Mark Schmid, from Neighborhood Cable, last month Mark did some follow up with his technical staff as to why we were having the occasional dropout across our wireless internet link. As a result of their investigations the microwave antenna has been relocated to our main tower as the link path was slightly marginal at its original location. The signal is now rock solid and we thank Mark and the team at Neighborhood Cable for their ongoing support.

# **Tower Update:**

Charlie, **VK3TCV**, has been working the world with his TH6 sitting on top of his new tower in Wendouree. Well done Charlie.

### **Membership Fees:**

There are still a handful of members who haven't paid their membership fee for 2005/06 and this will be the last newsletter you receive. An invoice will be sent to members whose subscription is still outstanding. This year the fees are \$30 for a member and \$40 for a family membership.

# **Repeater Update:**

lan, **VK3AXH**, reports that the rebuilt 2m repeater, VK3RWA, is almost ready to be moved to Mt Ben Nevis. It will undergo some local testing in the Ballarat area over the next few weeks prior to its move.

# **Construction Group:**

Work started on the Construction Group's latest project, the HF Antenna Analyser, at the meeting last week. This will take a few months to complete.



# **New Australian Amateur Radio Licencing Structure:**

The new Australian amateur radio licencing structure came into force on Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> October, from the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA). There are now 3 classes of licence for the Australian amateur radio service, being the Foundation, Standard and Advanced licence.

### Foundation Licence:

The Foundation licence can only use a transmitter that has been manufactured commercially, can only use voice, on either SSB, AM or FM or morse using a manually operated morse key, and not more than 10 watts output power SSB or 3 watts output power AM, FM or CW.

The Foundation licence can operate on the 80, 40, 15 and 10 metre bands as well as the 2 metre band and the band 430 to 450 MHz, subject to necessary bandwidth restrictions.

The new Foundation licence will utilise a new callsign structure comprising 4 letters in the suffix commencing with the letter F, eg: VK3FABC.

Discussions between the WIA and ACMA are currently underway in regard to the practicality of the 3 watt power limit for AM, FM and CW given that most commercial equipment operates has an output power of at least 10 watts.

### Standard Licence:

The Standard licence includes the previous Novice, and Novice Limited licensees, who now can use any emission mode with a necessary bandwidth not exceeding 8 kHz on the 80, 40, 20 and 15 metre bands, and any emission mode with a necessary bandwidth not exceeding 16 kHz on the 10 metre band, the band 52 to 54 MHz, the 2 metre band, and the bands 430 to 450 MHz, 1240 to 1300 MHz, 2,400 to 2,450 MHz and 5.650 to 5.850 GHz, with no change to the current output power limits of 100 watts and 30 watts.

### Advanced Licence:

The Advanced licence includes the previous Unrestricted licence, the Limited licence and the Intermediate licence, who can use any emission mode with a necessary bandwidth not exceeding 8 kHz on all bands below 24.990 MHz, any emission mode with a necessary bandwidth not exceeding 16 kHz on the 28.00 MHz to 29.70 MHz band, any emission mode with a necessary bandwidth not exceeding 100 kHz on the 6 and 2 metre bands and any emission mode with no bandwidth restriction above 420 MHz, and with no change to the current output power limits of 400 watts and 120 watts.

### **WIA Accredited Assessors:**

Congratulations to Craig, **VK3CMC**, who has successfully been accredited as a WIA Assessor. Craig is now qualified to assess potential amateurs for the new Foundation licence. Well done Craig.

### **Ballarat Airport Open Day:**

BARG has agreed to open its door to the public as part of the Ballarat Airport Open Day to be held on Saturday, 29<sup>th</sup> October. A number of members will be assisting during the day and we will have operating stations on HF, VHF, IRLP and APRS. With the introduction of the new Foundation Licence we will have as much information as possible available to introduce people to amateur radio. Activities will run from 10am until 5pm. Come along and join in the fun. The WIA is providing some large posters depicting various amateur radio activities as well as information pamphlets for prospective amateurs. Strictly Ham has kindly provided a large range of brochures on different types of radio equipment that is commercially available. As the Open Day is the day after our next General Meeting we intend having a shortened General Meeting so that all of the displays can be set up in readiness.

### **Ballarat Hamvention:**

lan, **VK3AXH**, our Hamvention Coordinator reports that plans for the Ballarat Hamvention, to be held on 6<sup>th</sup> November, are progressing well. The Hamvention has been advertised through a number of mediums including Amateur Radio magazine, various web sites and on the VK3RWA repeater. Traders will be permitted to enter the area at 8:00am and the general admission will commence at 10:00am. **Trading prior to the 10:00am commencement time is strictly forbidden**.

# **Propagation Report for September 2005**

This month has seen some good and not so good propagation on most of the bands HF and VHF.

Steve VK3SE reports good contact to made on 40/20/15 to VK and ZL with the odd good opening on 20 into the USA and Europe. Steve report he worked K7C on 18.175 using split frequency and a huge dog pile for this station. There is also a rare station VP8 around on 40 which is attracting huge pile ups.

Ernie VK3DET reported finally working S79EC after chasing that country for quite a while. Ernie is well on the way to having worked all prefix areas which is a great effort.

Charlie VK3TCV has been heard working lots of stations on 20. Ian Vk3AXH has also had some contacts into the US and Europe on 40 and 20.

The VHF/UHF scene is bubbling along with regular contacts via repeaters both near and far as well as some tropo from time to time Ian VK3AXH now has in possession QSL cards from HB9Q for EME contacts on both 2 metres and 70cm during this last month.

Several of the 160 metre verticals are now operating with VK3AIG, VK3FGC, VK3AXH and VK3CMC almost there. Although the band has been a bit noisy there are some good contacts to be made locally and DX.

# Paul Wild and the Italian connection!

I guess that most would know of our great Aussie Icon "The Dish" our 210 foot Radio Telescope situated at Parkes western NSW. Well it has a few smaller brothers or sisters I'm not sure of their gender but equally important to our overall results in the field of radio astronomy.

Six of them are situated out of Narribri western NSW. This facility is known as "The Australia Telescope Compact Array" located at the Paul Wild Observatory and is managed by the CSIRO in Sydney.

It seems to have become a habit each year as we journey south to stop over at Narribri and visit these towering monsters. Well this year was no exception but with a difference. At the center there is a large public display with all things relating from their construction to models of the feed horns, low noise amplifiers to photos of the signal processing computers at the control center.

The six dishes each of 22m diameter each weighing about 270 tonnes, the approximate weight of a jumbo 747. They are mounted on railway tracks about 10 m gauge! There are two tracks, east west and north south. Only five of these dishes are movable and the sixth is stationary. They are each individually powered and move along the tracks at about 4 km/hour. The maximum distance between the dishes is 6 km.

Positioning the dishes relative to one another permits greater "resolving" power and they can be used in conjunction with the likes of Parkes or other dishes around the world. In conjunction with the long weekend in NSW the Paul Wild Observatory held some special lectures for the public. At the conclusion on one of these talks I heard a voice say would you like to see through one of the dishes, well I think I was second in line! After donning hard hats we were off. It's a long climb to the radio hut and of course can only be reached when the dish is pointing straight up. At this point I recalled some words of wisdom from my Doctor about walking! The radio hut is quite small and houses the antenna feed horns on a turret assembly so the various bands can be changed bringing into focus the appropriate low noise amplifiers for the band of frequencies required.

In order to reduce thermal noise the amplifiers are cooled to -270 degrees. Well there it was all the radio front end equipment and from there the signals went downstairs to the eventual specialised signal processing.

Of interest to us "Hams" is the wavebands that these radio telescopes use.

3mm, 12mm, 3cm, 6cm, 13cm and 20cm. Well some of these look familiar!

Well the tour was made all the more palatable by a nice young Italian PhD student who was in charge of the current sky searching project.

Ps. Yes the car and caravan did swerve uncontrollably to the left approaching Parkes so I just had to sit and drool over a cup of coffee. I did wonder about the equivalent weight in Jumbo jets for this monster.

I see they are constructing a radio interferometer for Jupiter to one side of the car park. Its not finished yet but it's the sort of thing we could assemble at BARG. I wonder if it's to get schools involved in simple radio astronomy projects? Hopefully I'll find out next year!
