Radio Modernisation Project Update:

The Committee approved the purchase of a Diamond SX-100 VSWR meter which was obtained through **Strictly Ham**. The VSWR meter is functional from 1.6MHz – 60MHz.

Ross, **VK3SR**, from Melbourne has kindly donated a 13.8VDC @ 20A (continuous) rack mounted power supply to BARG for use with the project.

Merv, **VK3ADX**, and David **VK3UR**, installed the club's new TS-480sat, power supply and VSWR meter into the radio shack's console in time for the September General Meeting. The first contacts were made just prior to the General Meeting on 80m with club member Gavin, **VK3VTX**, who was on holiday in Mt Gambier and with Ballarat local David, **VK3KY**. Both gave excellent signal reports and the station has since been used several times, which is excellent to see.

The September General Meeting approved the purchase of a rotary dipole for the WARC-79 bands as well as an Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) to protect the shack computer. A TZ-RD-3W Rotary Dipole has been ordered from **Rippletech Antennas** in Melbourne and is due to be delivered in early November. When installed this antenna will provide capabilities for the club to operate on 10, 18 and 24MHz. One of the next items to be sourced / purchased will be the UPS.

Vice President Roger, **VK3ADE**, generously donated a surplus computer towards the modernisation project and this is currently offsite being configured. The computer has the capability to support dual screens, which will enable a number of programs to be displayed simultaneously.

The **Wireless Institute of Australia** will be presenting the \$900 cheque to BARG as part of the WIA Clubs Grant Scheme at the BARG Hamvention in November. The WIA grant was allocated to purchase the new HF rotary dipole, obtain / install antennas for 160m and 6m and purchase computer controlled antenna switching equipment that will be ordered shortly.

We are still looking for a 50 ohm, 100W Dummy Load (1.8 – 30MHz minimum) for use as part of the project. If you can assist please contact David, **VK3UR**, on 5334-1888 (AH) or by email at <u>vk3ur@barg.org.au</u>.

Propagation Report for September 2006

Well there has been some good openings on some of the HF band this past month. I have heard a few contests on and there were good DX contacts to be had on 80, 40 and 20 metres.

Roger VK3ADE reports that Doug VK3FDRE now has an excellent on 80 metres. I understand Doug has been working on his antenna setup so its great to see the improvement not only over the short distances but the ones further afield as well.

John Vk3AIG reports good signals to ZL on 160 metres with 599 reports in the early evening.....I might ask what's happening to all the 160 metre verticals we made?????

On VHF and above both Kevin VK3WN and Brian VK3KQB report some openings on 2 metres SSB to Tasmania and South Australia. David VK3YNB has also been active on a few of the bands.

VK3AXH EME Activity since installation of a 4x5WL 144MHz Array

My 1st EME contact was with W5UN on 21/8/04 using a single 12el yagi with no elevation. A further 14 contacts were made using the single yagi until use of the new array began on 3/4/06. The array is by DJ9BV and optimized by Lionel VE7BQH with all 18 elements of each yagi insulated from the boom. Only horizontal polarization is employed.

Total contacts to the end of August 2006 on 144 are as follows:-

Included in the above there are 2 CW and 2 SSB QSO's. Both SSB contacts were with RN6BN using his famous 1920 element array with Vertical and Horizontal Polarization. The initial SSB contact was tried after receiving signal levels of –6dB at both ends using JT65B on Saturday 26th August. Sam called me and I received him at 5X1 and he received me 4x4. We had 3x1 minute overs each. Sams log show this as the longest distance of 13,918Km in his list of 162 SSB contacts.

On Sunday 27th August at around 0640 UTC Sam began calling CQ using JT65B alternating between Vertical and Horizontal Polarity. He was 8dB stronger on Vertical Pol to me. When I saw a level of –6dB I called him on SSB and was surprised to hear him come back with a 5x1 report. I gave him 4x1 and again we had 3x1 minute overs.

Its great fun and I look forward to many more EME contacts in the future on 2 metres and eventually some of the higher bands.

Upcoming Big operations from Libya 5A7A. An international group of operators plan to activate this long quiet entity(many years) from Nov15 to Nov 29 2006 it is expected to generate huge interest and probably bad on-air behavior worse luck. It will require patience and a lot of luck to work this one.

The stations heard and worked mostly on dipoles and 100watts power out, so its possible to work DX with a modest station. Also you must listen at the correct time of day for the particular band, at this stage in the 11year Sunspot cycle nothing heard on 10metres and mostly a little Asia and Pacific on 15 metres.

17 Metres has a little activity but 20 Metres proves the most productive

especially in our late afternoon Long Path mostly to Europe and Middle East.

For a lot of good info and also to check in to the ANZA Net on 14.183mhz around 4pm local time (time changes from weekends to during the week.)

VHF/UHF (SSB)

6 metres – Kevin VK3WN has been busy monitoring and working some stations on the Magic Band. Some spasmodic openings to VK4 in the North and also an opening to ZL where 3 stations were worked.

2 metres – The unusal contacts to VK1,2,3 and 5 seem to be quite common with reports varying variable from day to day.

70cm – One morning resulted in contacts into VK5. With signals not all that strong good qso's were still to be had.

VHF/UHF Spring Field Day

Both VK3IDL and VK3AXH setup some antenna's at the trig point on Green Hill with a range of equipment covering 6m, 2m, 70cm, 23cm and 13cm. The main purpose of the exercise was to test out the 2.4G home brew equipment.

This proved to be a winner when contacts were made with a group in Geelong who were portable in the Barrabool Hills just west of the town (65K) where there signal was so strong the direction of the grid antenna being used was almost irrevelant. Given we were running only 50mw of power this was a great result. However better things lay ahead when a contact with David VK3HZ in the eastern suburbs of Melbourne was also worked (111K) with a S9+ signal from his 2 watts with a setup on the roof of his house.

Construction Group

Well another year has come and almost gone with the construction group completing yet another useful lot of equipment. The last project being the Antenna Analyser where around 15 kits were made. The test night proved to be very interesting with different loads and bands being used. In all this was one of the most interesting project in recent times and can be added to the earlier HF Analyser built.

Brian VK3KQB gave us a demo of a project – Noise Generator/Signal Source which will be undertaken in the new year. We hope to be able to make a suitable printed circuit board for this one so if you are interested join in the fun.

Hamvention 2006

Well another one has come and gone. The new venue is very good however there needs to be a good look at the suggestions and recommendations to make it better for next year and beyond. Several visitors have made a range of ideas to improve what was another successful event.
