HF Bands

VHF and Above

This month has seen quite a drop of in propagation with activity on 6 metres falling away. However given that the sunspot cycle has gone through its mimima we can only hope that it will get even better in the coming years. Kevin VK3WN being the most active station in the area has managed to work plenty of stations throughout VK and some of the Pacific Islands.

2 metres and above has been quite variable with some good openings to VK7 and VK5. Although the weather has now cooled off a bit there has been some excellent openings into and beyond Adelaide on both 2m and 70cm with Ian VK3AXH working VK5NEX in Whyalla at signal report of 5x3 (SSB). Lets hope the trend continues. There is also a rise in the number of stations getting on 1296MHz. In our own area we now have around 6 active stations with others at Ararat, Horsham and Nhill.
