Minutes of the Previous

(April) general meeting had been distributed previously, they were passed as being correct, with one minor correction, George Fowler Auction was Sunday, not Saturday. Moved Warren VK3FWJW, Bob VK3BNC - carried.

General Business

President - Doug VK3VBA Suggested that the Club might have a dining night at the Greyhound Club, on a night when the Dogs were running, this could be a bit of good P.R, as well as being a good night out. Everyone agreed with this suggestion.

Bob VK3BNC Gave a presentation on the operation and setup of the remote base radio, Bob can set up any new users who want to operate remotely as long as they have a suitable internet connection.

Craig VK3CMC Raised the issue of VK3RBA repeaters having been off the air for more than six months, other reasonably local repeaters are also off the air or unreliable meaning that many operators have no access to 2 metres, 70cm or 23cm.

This stimulated a lot of discussion on this issue -

Gordon VK3FGC spoke about a fairly damning report that the Ombudsman had prepared regarding the tendering and contracting of IT within the Victoria Police, this report was partly responsible for the removal of non-police equipment from Police sites.

Bob VK3BNC suggested that we might be better off looking at an alternative site for the equipment, even if approval was gained to reinstall at Mt Buninyong, if it meant that we would have to pay for our own electricity etc. this would not be an unmanageable expense. Bob had a copy of an email that Ian VK3AXH had sent to Geoff Howard MLA asking him to see if he could help in getting the repeaters returned to operation.

Craig VK3CMC moved, and Ian VK3IDL seconded, "that BARG should write to Geoff Howard endorsing Ian's request, and asking for a response in time to report to the June meeting" The motion was passed almost unanimously.

Craig also moved, and it was seconded by Bob VK3NBV "that BARG should write to WICEN seeking assurance that our repeater equipment is safely and securely stored, and is in a fit state for recommissioning as soon as approval is granted for its re-installation", this motion too was passed with almost no dissent.

Clem VK3VBI suggested that now the workshop was better equipped, and more usable that we might consider buying a metal folder for the use of members wanting to make their own chassis, or boxes for projects, the club had considered this previously but thought that the cost would be too high for the limited use it might get. It was moved by Clem, and seconded by Doug VK3FDRE that we could at least research the price and availability of a small folder suitable for our purpose.

Gordon bought up the fact that the workshop is a bit short of tools, and moved that we should spend up to \$100 on small tools as required, this motion was seconded by Warren VK3FWJW.

There being nothing more to discuss, meeting closed at 2125. Next meeting 26th June 1930.

<u>A Proposal for an alternative BARG Voice Repeater to</u> <u>serve the Ballarat region.</u>

With no immediate prospects of resolution of the ongoing debarkle of BARG's Voice Repeater at Mt Buninyong an alternative appears to be to walk away from that scene and establish a new repeater with total autonomy for BARG in terms of access, control and outright ownership.

Possible sites.

<u>Hollow Back.</u> This is the site of the APRS installation and also VK3RBU. This site is controlled by AR Vic and room for expansion is very limited and also providing limited coverage of our intended area.

<u>Green Hill.</u> By far a better coverage can be expected from this site with some shading towards parts of Melbourne and Geelong with extensive coverage in all other directions.

The property is owned by Mr Doug Ellery and a small section is leased by a Ballarat firm "Sectrol" with limited communication services from their radio facility on the site. Doug is agreeable to BARG using this facility in conjunction with Sectrol.

Requirements for a repeater site to meet BARG's needs.

<u>Access to site</u>. A made road is available and added security provided by locked access to which BARG would have available 24/7.

<u>Tower</u>. A proposed three section (1800mm X 3) rugged galvanized steel tower and a 50mm extension pole to a height of approximately 2.4m height pivoted for tilt over handling and mounted on appropriate concrete footings. This is a self supporting construction as no guys are permitted on the site.

<u>Power</u>. Power would be supplied by Sectrol and BARG would pay for its own equipment consumption.

<u>Building</u>. Access to Sectrol's building for the housing of the proposed repeater is agreed on a 24/7 basis. BARG would need to provide a suitable rack or cabinet.

BARG's Officers would be responsible for security of the site on maintenance visits etc. BARG would contribute to "handyman" type maintenance of the overall site.

Other requirements for the establishment of the repeater:

Application for a license to operate a repeater on the Green Hill site to the WIA with ACMA Forms RO57 and RO77 for registration which will then be forwarded to the Repeater Co-ordinating Committee.

Mr Ian McDonald, VK3AXH, be listed as the nominee.

Some formal agreement document covering insurance issues on the site.

Some formal agreement document covering any sub leasing issues with Sectrol.

Repeater estimated setup costs for Green Hill.

Tower Concrete costs.	\$208.00.
Steel, welding and sundry costs.	\$200.00.
Coax and fittings.	\$150.00
Vertical Antenna.	\$150.00
Equipment Cabinet.	\$ 50.00
License Fee.	

<u>Repeater equipment.</u> Depending on what equipment is recovered from the old installation that will dictate what equipment will be required.

I believe that we should formally request all BARG's equipment removed from the Mt Buninyong site to be returned.

Equipment recovered from the old Ben Nevis site is available but looking to the long term it will represent an upgrade at some stage in the near future. This includes a transceiver and control equipment. Depending on the new frequency the antenna may not be suitable.
