King Arthur Round Table Net

Back in June 2013 I started a net called the 21.30 net held on the VK3RBA 70cm repeater every Monday evening at 21.30 hours local time We had about 7 stations on average lasting for about 45 min.

As more repeaters were added to the link system such as VK3RWU Mt William and digital modes and many others, the net started to grow to a point where it got late and would end between 23.30 and midnight local time

So we decided to change the time and date of the net.


With these changes we named it the King Arthur Round Table Net held every Wednesday night starting from 28/8/19 at 8.00 pm local time.

Currently we average from 20 to 40 stations that join us most weeks, the time of the net can vary but usually goes for 2½ hours.

The maximum number of stations we've had was about 42 stations.

The general format is when stations check in, they tell me if they are listening only or having 1 round or if they don't say anything usually means they are in for 2 rounds.

I usually ask many questions during the net to bring in more topics and to keep the ham community together.

Herewith I am sending you two QSL cards, by means of verification and also a view card of Tashkent.



VHF and Above December 2021



With the warmer weather beginning to stabilise there is evidence that things are starting to improve on VHF propagation and above.

Beacons on 2mx are being heard from Adelaide, Barossa Valley, Mt Gambier, Gippsland and Tasmania. So far this has been mainly in the mornings. Local stations heard have been VK3KG, VK3AXH with good reports in both directions.

Activity has also increased with some new groups being heard from South Gippsland and a group in NE Tasmania. Most are using moderate antenna systems and modest power.

There has also been some DX on 2mx across the ditch ie East coast of VK to ZL where I have seen postings of SSB contacts being made. Being that much further West, we don't get the same opportunities.

Recently I re installed my 6mx antenna and on the 1st day had a 5x9 qso with VK4FNQ in Northern Queensland and VK2FZR near Tweed Heads also at S9. The next day I had SSB qso's with 2 stations in the Perth area and a CW qso with VK6FO.

Also noted is the activity from Paul VK3TXR who I often hear on 6mx WSPR. I also understand that David VK3KQT has also been monitoring 6mx as well.

Let's hope this column next month shows plenty of activity and more reports from club members on these interesting bands.

Recently Peter VK3PWG whilst in Gippsland did some tests on the Gippsland Beacons. Peter did tests on 2mx, 1296 and 2.4G with good signals being received. This has stirred us up as there are also beacons operating on the 3.4G, 5.7G and 10G as well so it's hoped we can do some propagation tests from Mt Buninyong before the next VHF Field Day which is scheduled for the weekend of 15/16 January.

If you have some gear tucked away now is the time to blow the dust off it and get ready to participate.

Lach VK3ALM Hi, I hope you are all well.


What I would like is a few suggestions for a suggested Ballarat list for the UV-5r and GD77 radios (and others).

ISS SSTV Transmission

Set for Late December



The Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) team will support Slow Scan TV (SSTV) transmissions from the International Space Station (ISS), December 26 – 31. The images will be related to lunar exploration.

Transmissions should be available worldwide on 145.800 MHz FM, using SSTV mode PD120.

Transmissions are set to start on December 26 at about 1825 UTC and end December 31 at about 1705 UTC. The signal should be receivable on a handheld transceiver with a quarter-wave whip antenna. Use the widest filter for 25 kHz channel spacing.
