Mr Mather was asked, by the Ameri can; announcer inform Commander Yancey, officer. in charge of the luxury flying boat Guba, now at Port Phillip, that his brother-in-law had died. Mr Mather promised to ' deliver the message to Commander Yancey, and, after getting in touch with radio people in Melbourne, the message: was passed on.
